Principal's Column

I vividly remember as a kid the summer holidays between Grade 5 and Grade 6. I became close friends with one of the other boys who would be in my class in Grade 6. It was a friendship that didn't last a long time but had a profound influence on my life.

Steve and I were inseparable during those holidays and throughout that Grade 6 year. Apart from sitting next to each other in class, we went to each other's houses every day after school and spent weekends out riding our bikes and doing things. Doing stuff that I would never have allowed my own kids to do. These were the days when kids would just go off someplace, often without telling their parents and as long as they were home before the street lights came on, it was ok.

Anyway, apart from all the great things we did – exploring down the creek, loong bike rides, fishing, swimming, visiting the old museum in the city (yes we did) – I learned so much just from being with this kid, Steve.

He was very different to anyone I had ever known before. He seemed to know something about just about everything. He had a maturity and views and understandings way beyond mine. He was interested in science and electronics and cooking. He was into everything, he would ask questions and he had

opinions on everything. As I said, he had a huge impact on me.

And then we went to secondary school, where we were put into different classes and I think he found other interests and things just sort of faded. And life went on.

I was told that he passed away some time ago and I felt so deeply sorry. I thought about Steve many times over the years; what he would've done in particular situations, what he would've said, what were the right questions to ask.

A couple of years ago I happened to stumble across a graphic arts business and it was Steve's. He was alive, not completely well, but going ok.

I was able to make contact and we arranged to catch up. Gee it was good to see him. I went to his house and it was amazing. You could hardly move in the place because there was just so much stuff. There were musical instruments, painter's easels and paints, and every kind of gadget you could imagine. In my mind, it was a reflection of *his* mind.

He was the same Steve but he was different. We clearly had both moved off in different directions. He remembered things about when we were kids that I had absolutely no recollection of. I told him how he had influenced me and he told me that I had influenced him. He said I had taught him about humour and seeing the

funny side of things. I felt good about that because I never felt as a kid that I was able to teach him anything – he seemed to already know everything.

There's a great story by Stephen King called 'The Body' – the film 'Stand By Me' was based on it. There is a line in the book and the movie that goes, "I never had any friends later on like the ones I had when I was twelve. Jesus, did you?"

Nope.

2019 Classes – Parent Input

Often during this time of year the school begins to get questions about how class lists for the next school year are developed. Basically, we begin working on this early in Term 4. The following criteria are considered as the staff creates a recommendation to the principal for class composition that includes:

- students with special learning styles and needs
- high achieving students
- balanced male/female ratios where possible
- known interpersonal relationships that will maintain a positive class climate
- teacher recommendation
- learning & teaching style balance
- parent concerns

Please note that **parent requests are considered *when the request is based on the learning style of the student or other known factors that may have a positive or negative influence on the child.*** We do *not* place children based on simple choice. As noted above many factors are taken into consideration.

Here are the steps to the process:

1. In the newsletter, parents will be notified to *send a written letter to the principal* if they want to give input to the process of class placement for their child.
2. The letter *must be received by the school no later than **26th October*** in order to be considered. This is an important deadline as letters received after that date will be too late to be considered.
3. The letter must state the criteria and learning environment best suited for the student as per the parent opinion (this is a *piece* of the input to the process along with the teacher input). We ask that you do NOT request a teacher specifically by name.
4. In Term 4, the principal will direct the teaching staff to prepare class lists for 2019 based on the criteria listed above including both teacher and parent input.
5. Upon completion of the draft class lists the principal will meet with each grade level

team of teachers to review the lists and discuss the criteria for how they were developed.

6. Parents are informed of their child's class placement prior to the end of the school year.


