## Principal's Column

### DEVELOPING CONFIDENCE

Self-confidence is a key to children's attitude, success and achievement. By 'confidence' I mean feeling good about oneself, wanting to take risks and accept challenges to become a better person. Confidence is not something parents or teachers can teach children. Confidence is developed when the culture of family and the school promote it. There is no 'one size fits all' approach to building children's confidence. However, there is a strong relationship between confidence and what children can **do**, what they **think** about themselves and how they **feel**.

To work on the **do** part, we need to build children's abilities.

To work on the **think**, we can model, teach and promote positive attitudes and thinking.

To work on the **feel**, we can use encouraging words to support children become a little more willing to attempt new activities, or perhaps dispel existing fears. Parents and teachers can focus on the following to support children and encourage them to:

- Be optimistic by looking for something positive in any situation. Model looking for positives yourself.
- Children pick up optimism and pessimism by watching their parents and teachers, so consider the impact on their thinking your behaviour may have.
- Challenge themselves in every aspect of life, including learning, making friends, playing

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sports, resolving conflict, etc.

- Have a go and take some risks where failure is a real possibility. For example, enter a talent show, audition for the choir, or try out for a team.
- Act strong because body language communicates a lot about you. Strong and assertive body language makes you feel more confident (without coming across as a bully!).
- Be enthusiastic about learning, people and all family and school activities. Enthusiasm helps develop confidence and overcome fear.

Let's all remember that self-confidence building is perhaps the most powerful skill parents and teachers can support children with.

## Victorian Premier's Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premier's Reading Challenge is now open and Oak Park Primary School is excited to be participating.

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 8 September 2017.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and can choose to have their name included on the online Honour Roll. If you would like your child's name to appear on the Honour Roll, please sign the attached form and return it to your classroom teacher.

Welcome to the 2017 Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge.

For over a decade, the Challenge has promoted the importance of reading among children and students, encouraging them and their families to read more widely and more often.

We know that reading is critical to the development of our kids. It's why the Challenge is so important. It helps children understand the world around them, developing their language skills and nurturing their imagination. Catering for all interests from birth to Year 10, the Challenge has more than 9,000 titles.

For children from birth to five, the challenge is for parents and carers to read 40 books with their child/children. For students from Prep to Year 2, the challenge is to read or experience 30 books and for students in Years 3 to 10, the challenge is to read 15 books.

Children who complete the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement. They will also have the opportunity to see their name on an online honour roll.

### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

**Definitions:** *Department* refers to the Victorian Department of Education and Training. *Person* refers to the child/adult listed below in the consent declaration.

#### 1) Privacy Protection

The Department takes its privacy obligations seriously and any personal information collected or used by the Department will be handled in accordance with the *Privacy and Data Protection Act 2014* (Vic). This law sets out what we must do when the Department collects, uses, handles and destroys personal information. Personal information includes personal details such as an individual's name and school that could be used to identify an individual.
